This year, with the very welcome help of **Graham Lewis (Merseyside CTC)**, we had decided to duplicate our usual method of timing riders by using **electronic tagging** to log people from start time to their finish time.



It proved very successful, so we must now decide if we should spend some money to buy the necessary equipment for future events.

183 riders were eventually processed through the manual and electronic system and directed to their start position for the day.



The **1st check of the day at Cuddington** went smoothly before the onward ride to **lunch at Overton.**

Whilst everyone did take lunch (they had paid for it!), some rested less than most and were back at Kinnerton in well under 4 hours.
